- PHILLIP: Me or her?
- MR. DOBBS: She leaves! You stay! Now, take a seat!
- 3 PHILLIP: Again, I would, but ... I don't think she's budging.
- 4 MADISON: I'm not!
- MR. DOBBS: Fine! Fine, fine, fine, fine! One more picture 5
- 6 of you, Miss Riley!
- 7 MADISON: Thank you.
- 8 MR. DOBBS: Shoulders to the side. Chin down. Head tilted. Sit
- 9 up straight. And hold it ... (Steps back.) Smile!
- MADISON: (Quickly moves into a dramatic pose and smiles. After 10
- the picture is taken, she jumps up.) Yes!
- MR. DOBBS: I told you not to do that! The school pictures are
- 13 all supposed to look the same!
- MADISON: (Smiling) Oops. Sorry.
- 15 MR. DOBBS: Sit down! We're doing it again!
- MADISON: No! I liked that pose! It'll be cute.
- MR. DOBBS: Sit down!
- MADISON: No! (Starts off.)
- 19 MR. DOBBS: (Follows her.) Come back here! We're going to take
- 20 another picture of you! Then another and another and
- 21 another if that's what it takes! You will look like the rest of
- 22 vour classmates!
- MADISON: But I don't want to look like the rest of my
- 24 classmates! I want to look cute! (MADISON and MR. DOBBS
- 25 exit as PHILLIP is left standing there. After a moment, he sits
- 26 down in the chair, looks around, and then smiles.)

2. Lost

CAST: (1M, 3F) MRS. MILLS, RYAN, CASSIE, JANIE PROPS: Map, schedule. SETTING: Classroom.

(At rise MRS. MILLS is teaching class as RYAN rushes into the room. CASSIE and JANIE are seated at their desks. Other students at desks are optional.)

MRS. MILLS: Correlative conjunctions are used to draw a correlation between elements in a sentence. They bring different things together and they work in pairs. For example ...

RYAN: (Enters.) I know, I know! know!

MRS. MILLS: (Looks at watch.) Mr. Hodges, this is the third day in a row that you've been late to class.

RYAN: I know!

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MRS. MILLS: First day of school, I could understand. Second day, OK, you're still finding your way around. But today ...?

RYAN: OK, so I was coming from the science wing and I took a right at the gym, left at the choir room, then another right at the cafeteria, but then I just stopped and looked around. I thought, am I supposed to go to the right or to the left? Right or left? So I took a right.

MRS. MILLS: That was wrong.

RYAN: I know that now.

MRS. MILLS: Mr. Hodges, did you not receive a school map on the first day of school?

RYAN: (Pulls out a large map.) I have it right here. But it's still confusing!

MRS. MILLS: Hogwash. Anvone with any common sense can look at a map and find their way around. (Takes map.) How

- 1 hard is this? A Hall, B Hall, C Hall ...
- 2 RYAN: D Hall. E Hall. F, G, H, I, J, K, L, M, N ... There's a hundred
- 3 freaking halls in this school! I mean, in elementary, there
- 4 were like four halls, plus the cafeteria and the gym. But
- 5 this ... (Waves map.) Look, Z-14! I have a math class in Hall
- 6 Z-14. Room 240, I think. But I haven't even made it in
- 7 there yet!
- 8 MRS. MILLS: You've never been to your math class? Where
- 9 have you been going?
- 10 RYAN: Roaming the halls looking for Z-14!
- 11 MRS. MILLS: Then why didn't you go to the office and ask for
- 12 help?
- 13 RYAN: Because I couldn't find the office!
- 14 MRS. MILLS: Mr. Hodges, watch your tone of voice with me!
- 15 RYAN: I'm sorry.
- 16 MRS. MILLS: Class, is anyone else having trouble finding their
- way around school? (CASSIE raises her hand.) Yes, Cassie?
- 18 CASSIE: Well, on the first day of school I accidentally went to
- 19 lunch during third period instead of fourth.
- 20 MRS. MILLS: But did you get lost?
- 21 CASSIE: No, Ma'am.
- 22 MRS. MILLS: And have you been late to class?
- 23 CASSIE: No, Ma'am.
- 24 MRS. MILLS: And do you think you could find the Z-14 hall?
- 25 CASSIE: Yes, Ma'am, because I have a class in the Z-15 hall, so
- 26 I'd be just one hall over.
- 27 MRS. MILLS: Then could you please come up here and explain
- to Mr. Hodges how to find the Z-14 hall?
- 29 CASSIE: Sure. (Goes to the front of the classroom. Takes RYAN'S
- 30 map.) OK, here's the front of the school.
- 31 RYAN: But I'm not coming from the front of the school!
- 32 MRS. MILLS: Do you always have to make everything so
- 33 difficult?
- 34 CASSIE: It's OK. So where do you start?
- 35 RYAN: (Takes out his schedule.) OK, from Hall G-22 I go to Hall Z-14.

- CASSIE: OK, that's easy. Look.
- MRS. MILLS: Are you paying attention, Mr. Hodges?
- RYAN: Yes, Ma'am.
- CASSIE: So here you are at Hall G-22, right?
- RYAN: Right.
- CASSIE: (Points to the map.) So you take a right here, then two quick lefts, then another right, up the stairs to the S-Wing, another right, up one more flight of stairs to the W-Hall,
- an immediate left, a little curve to the right and a quick left and there you are! Hall Z-14!
- RYAN: A right, then two quick lefts, then what?
- CASSIE: Do you want me to use my highlighter on your map?
- MRS. MILLS: Oh my gosh! You'd think this was rocket science!
 Mr. Hodges, was Cassie not clear enough on the directions?
- RYAN: Sure, but ... OK, it's a right, a left, another left, up the stairs, then right or left ... (Screams in frustration) I can't remember! How am I supposed to remember all that?
- 10 CASSIE: (Trying to be helpful) Mrs. Mills, I can highlight this for Ryan.
- MRS. MILLS: Class, does anyone else have trouble understanding these directions? (*Pause*) Anyone? Janie, do you think you could find your way to Hall Z-14?
- 4 JANIE: Yes, Ma'am.
- MRS. MILLS: Could you come up here and give Ryan the directions one more time since he's never even been to his class in Hall Z-14?
- JANIE: (Moves to the front of the class.) Yes, Ma'am. (Takes the map.) You're starting from Hall G-22, right?
- RYAN: Mrs. Mills, is this really necessary? I'll study my map tonight, OK?
- MRS. MILLS: But you need to find your math class in Hall Z-14 today, isn't that correct, Mr. Hodges?
- 34 RYAN: Yes, but ...
- MRS. MILLS: Go ahead, Janie.

- 1 JANIE: (Holding up map) OK, starting from Hall G-22, you take
- a right, then a left, then another left, then a right, go up
- 3 the stairs to the S-Wing, then take a right, then up another
- 4 flight of stairs to the W-Hall, then a left, then turn right
- 5 here, turn quickly to the right and there you are. Got it?
- 6 RYAN: No! No, I don't have it!
- 7 MRS. MILLS: (Shaking head, frustrated) Mr. Hodges, do you have
- 8 any sense of direction?
- 9 RYAN: Sense of direction, yes, but finding my way around a
- 10 hundred different halls, no!
- 11 JANIE: Maybe I should write it down for him.
- 12 RYAN: Do you mind?
- 13 MRS. MILLS: And what's going to happen when you enter the
- 14 real world, Mr. Hodges? When you learn to drive and have
- to find your way around the city? Are you going to drive
- around all day and miss work because you couldn't find
- 17 the correct street?
- 18 RYAN: No, I'll probably have a GPS. Hey, maybe I need a GPS for
- 19 school! (He laughs, but the others don't.)
- 20 MRS. MILLS: That wasn't funny.
- 21 RYAN: Obviously not.
- 22 JANIE: I have a suggestion.
- 23 MRS. MILLS: Yes, Janie?
- 24 JANIE: I could stay after school and teach him how to find his
- 25 way around.
- 26 CASSIE: I could help, too.
- 27 MRS. MILLS: Thank you, girls. That's very nice of you.
- 28 RYAN: I'm not staying after school!
- 29 MRS. MILLS: I don't see that you have a choice, Mr. Hodges.
- 30 RYAN: (Halfway laughing) I don't need two girls showing me
- 31 how to get to my classes.
- 32 MRS. MILLS: Mr. Hodges, how many days have you been in this
- 33 school?
- 34 RYAN: Three.
- 35 MRS. MILLS: And how many times have you been late for my

- class?
- RYAN: Three.
- MRS. MILLS: And how many classes have you been late for, not including mine?
- RYAN: Not counting the classes I never went to because I couldn't find them?
- MRS. MILLS: Yes!

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- RYAN: All of them. I've either been late or never went because I was lost.
- MRS. MILLS: And you don't need help after school learning your way around?
- 12 RYAN: I don't think so.
- MRS. MILLS: Quick! How do you get to Hall Z-14?
- RYAN: Uh, a right, a left, uh, another right, uh, up the stairs ...
- MRS. MILLS: Wrong! Cassie, Janie, plan on helping Mr. Hodges after school.
- 17 RYAN: But ...
- MRS. MILLS: And plan to go over it again and again if that's what it takes!
- 0 RYAN: But ...
- MRS. MILLS: Thank you, girls. And Mr. Hodges, tomorrow ...
 don't be late!
- RYAN: But ...
- IANIE: And remember, Ryan, each flight of stairs has its own letter, too. A-F stairs are on the first floor.
- II CASSIE: G-L stairs are on the second floor.
- JANIE: M and N are a little confusing because they go down to the basement, but if you accidentally go down there and get lost, just take the B-1 or B-14 hall back to the main stairs, then you can start from the beginning.
- CASSIE: And you can always go to the office.
- II RYAN: Wherever that is.
- CASSIE: It's behind the band hall. See, you come in through the main entrance, take a right at the teacher's lounge, quick left at the cafeteria, turn down the D hall, take the E stairs

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1	to the second floor, then another right to the G stairs, but
2	remember, don't take the M stairs because that'll take you
3	back down to the basement, and then
4	RYAN: Whoa! Wait! Stop! Please, stop!
5	MRS. MILLS: Confused again, Mr. Hodges?
6	RYAN: Confused? Yes, I'm confused! Confused out of my mind!
7	MRS. MILLS: (Shaking her head) Some students just try my
8	patience.
9	JANIE: It's not that hard, Ryan.
10	CASSIE: Really!
11	MRS. MILLS: All right, everyone back in their seats. Why don't
12	we spend the rest of the class time doing something else

besides teaching Mr. Hodges how to find his way around

the school! All right, everyone open their books to chapter

two. Mr. Hodges, do vou need help finding chapter two?

3. A Change of Attitude

CAST: (2M, 1F) JAVIER, DEREK, TRINA PROPS: Lunch trays, utensils, glass of water.

(At rise JAVIER and DEREK are sitting at a table in a lunchroom.) JAVIER: (Eating, with his mouth full) Derek, what's wrong with you? Why aren't you eating? DEREK: Because I'm fat! **JAVIER: What?** DEREK: I'm fat! JAVIER: That's ridiculous! You're not fat! DEREK: Yes, I am! (Stands, squeezes his stomach.) See? JAVIER: No. DEREK: (Continues to squeeze his stomach.) Look! See? JAVIER: Quit being stupid. Sit down and eat. You're not fat. DEREK: (Sits down.) Do you know how many calories are in a kernel of corn? JAVIER: I don't know? Maybe one? DEREK: Then I'll only eat like fifty or something. That should get me through the day. (Eats a kernel.) One. Two. (Continues to eat and count.) TRINA: (Enters carrying a lunch tray.) Hey, guys. JAVIER: Hey, Trina. DEREK: Three ... four ... five ... TRINA: Derek, why are you counting kernels of corn? DEREK: I'm counting calories.

TRINA: Why?

MA JAVIER: He's on a diet.
