7	JO: Well there's this new boy at school. Tyler Jones. And
8	I'd like for him to notice me and he won't even look m
9	way. I've tried, but nothing is working.
10	PAT: Aaaah, now I understand.

Believing

Introduction

A crystal ball isn't always necessary to see the future. In this scene, ROBIN helps her blind daughter, PAT, prepare to go to the prom.

- PAT: How is my dress, Mom? My hair?
- 2 ROBIN: Perfect, sweetie. You look absolutely beautiful.
- 3 PAT: Are you sure? I'm so nervous. I can't believe I'm
- 4 getting to go to the prom.
- 5 ROBIN: Well, you are and with one of the nicest,
- 6 handsomest boys in school!
- 7 PAT: Jimmy is so special.
- 8 ROBIN: Yes, he is, and he's a very lucky young man 'cause
- 9 he's getting to go out with my daughter!
- 10 PAT: On her first date, to the prom!
- 11 ROBIN: Yes!
- 12 PAT: And after this, I'm going to graduate and go off to
- 13 college —
- 14 ROBIN: And graduate from there and then have a wonderful
- 15 life!
- 16 PAT: Do you think so, Momma? There's going to be so many
- 17 changes.
- 18 ROBIN: I know so.
- 19 PAT: So many changes for a blind girl.
- 20 ROBIN: A lot of changes for any girl. But not any you can't
- 21 master. Remember, who was it who talked her mother
- 22 into letting her skydive at twelve and bungee jump at
- 23 sixteen? That girl can conquer anything else that's
- 24 waiting for her out there.
- 25 PAT: Do you truly believe that, Momma? (The front

- 1 doorbell chimes.)
- 2 ROBIN: I do. Hear that? I think somebody's prom date in
- 3 here. We better get you downstairs.
- 4 PAT: Thank you, Momma. Thank you for taking care of me
- 5 my whole life. Thank you for believing in me.
- 6 ROBIN: Come on. Hurry. We can't keep Jimmy waiting.

Blasé

Introduction

Blasé means to be unconcerned and that pretty much sums up PAT in this scene. Unfortunately, JO doesn't feel that way.

- 1 JO: You shouldn't have done it.
- 2 PAT: You really don't seem to have much appreciation for
- 3 what I've done for you.
- 4 JO: I don't! (Tearful) He was my boyfriend.
- 5 PAT: Was is the operative word here. And boyfriends are a
- dime a dozen for a looker like you. There'll be plenty of
- 7 others.
- 8 JO: Maybe so, but this morning, he was the only one I had!
- 9 PAT: Sweetie, he was no good for you. I did you a favor.
- 10 JO: Huh? How can you say that? I don't believe you. Pat,
- 11 you ran over him!
- 12 PAT: No, Jo, I didn't "run" over him. I didn't run over
- anybody. Technically, my vehicle veered to the right at a
- 14 great deal of speed and came in contact with him
- 15 jogging at a very low rate of speed after which he
- became airborne for thirty feet and landed on his head.
- 17 So, actually, I struck him. I didn't run over him.
- 18 JO: Same difference.
- 19 PAT: Whatever makes you happy, dear.
- 20 JO: I hate you. I hate you so much. I hate you more than
- 21 you could ever know.
- 22 PAT: Someday, you'll thank me for this.
- 23 JO: I hope you go to jail. I hope the police come and drag
- you off and throw you in jail.
- 25 PAT: Why? It was an accident. All the witnesses said so.
