- 1 MEREDITH: (Appalled) Mom! I can't ask him that!
- 2 MOM: Why not? He's getting all the Doritos and Pepsi he
- 3 can eat and drink. The least he can do is throw in a loaf
- 4 of French bread.
- 5 MEREDITH: You're going to drive me crazy, do you know
- 6 that?
- 7 MOM: That's the plan.

55. A Good Deed Run Amok

Topic: Trying to do a good deed backfires on a guy who finds a phone.

Cast:

TONY: just trying to be a nice guy

NORRIS: tough, grouchy

GINNY: overly-excited, talks *very* quickly BECKY: the hurt and angry ex-girlfriend

MOM: a typical mom (or her voicemail, anyway)

DEVIN: the real owner of the phone and not particularly friendly or

thankful

- (TONY crosses the stage and happens across a cell phone on
- 2 the floor. He should stay Center while the others come on
- **3** from opposite sides of the stage. No one should look at TONY.)
 - 4 TONY: Hey! Someone must have dropped their phone.
- 5 (Looks around.) I wonder whose it is. (He opens it, closes
- 6 it, and looks on the back. Pauses.) How in the world do I
- find out how to get it back to the owner? I'd die if I lost
- 8 my phone. I know! I'll call the last number on the phone
- 9 and ask them. (Dials.)
- 10 NORRIS: Yo.
- 11 TONY: (Hesitant but cheerful) Oh, uh, hi. I just found this
- 12 phone, and —
- 13 NORRIS: What do you want? You woke me up.
- 14 TONY: (A little unsure) Oh, sorry. I just wanted to see if you
- 15 could tell me —
- 16 NORRIS: (Suspicious) Hey, how did you get this number? I
- 17 never give out this number.
- 18 TONY: Well, I found this phone, and -
- 19 NORRIS: (Interrupting) Is this Spike?

- 1 TONY: No, it's Tony.
- 2 NORRIS: I don't know no Tony.
- 3 TONY: Yeah, I know. I —
- 4 NORRIS: (Interrupting again and angry) Then whatcha doin'
- 5 callin' me? And how did you get this number? Did Spike
- 6 give you my number? Wait 'til I see him.
- 7 TONY: Is this Spike's phone?
- 8 NORRIS: (Pause) What?
- 9 TONY: Am I calling from Spike's phone?
- 10 NORRIS: (Pause) How in the world would I know? You called
- 11 me.
- 12 TONY: You see, I found this phone, and —
- 13 NORRIS: You tell Spike I said he gives out my number again
- and I'll get back at him.
- 15 TONY: No, no, you don't understand. (NORRIS hangs up.)
- Well, that was fun. (Scrolls through the phone numbers
- 17 again). Should I try again? I'll try dialing someone on
- purpose. Here's a promising listing, *Home.* (Dials.)
- 19 GINNY: Oh, my gosh, you won't believe what happened
- 20 (TONY continually tries to interrupt but GINNY won't let him
- 21 get a word in.) Cynthia Parker told me that Justin McNair
- told her that Bobby Michael likes me! Oh, my gosh, can
- you believe it? I tried to call Mom on her cell but I think
- she's in book club and then I called Susie Thomas and
- 25 she's at an orthodontist appointment. I called Tammy
- 26 Long, even though I don't like her very much, because
- 27 she used to like Bobby and I thought she might get
- jealous. But she didn't answer and, anyway, she isn't all
- that much fun to talk to. So I was going to call you, but
- 30 then Sherry called and I told her and she said she had
- 31 already heard from Karen Roberts that Bobby liked me,
- like last week! I asked her why she didn't tell me and she
- 33 said she wanted to make sure before she told me
- 34 because she knows how much I like him and didn't want
- 35 to tell me if it wasn't true. So now that I know it's true,

- 1 I've got to call Cammy and Tiffany and Rachel, Byel
- 2 (Hangs up.)
- TONY: (Pauses, looks at phone.) Man, that tired me out. This
- 4 poor guy has to live with that? I'll try another number.
- 5 (Dials.)
- 6 BECKY: (Obviously angry) I can't believe you called me.
- 7 TONY: Hi, um, Becky? This is -
- 8 BECKY: I know who this is, you jerk. Two weeks without so
- 9 much as a phone call or e-mail and now you're going to
- 10 call me the night before the dance.
- 11 TONY: No, you don't -
- 12 BECKY: (Mounting anger) I don't ever want to talk to you
- again. You're a jerk and I hate you. Don't ever call me
- 14 again! (Hangs up.)
- 15 TONY: Don't worry, I won't. (Stares at the phone for a long
- 16 time.) I wonder if it's even worth it. (Dials again.)
- 17 MOM: (Super sweet) Helloooo! This is Margaret and, guess
- what? I can't get to the phone. Please leave your name
- 19 and number and I'll call back. Thank you!
- 20 TONY: (Hesitates.) Uh, Mom? Well, this is Tony. I know you
- 21 don't know me, and I'm sure you don't have a son
- 22 named Tony, anyway, I have this phone and your name
- 23 was on it as Mom so I thought I'd call you to see if you
- could tell me whose phone it really is but then, someone,
- at home told me you were at book club or something.
- 26 (Pauses, obviously confusing himself.) Anyway, please call
- this number back and tell me who I am. (DEVIN walks by,
- sees him with the phone.)
- 29 DEVIN: Hey, is that my phone?
- 30 TONY: Man, I hope so.
- 31 DEVIN: (Suspiciously) What are you doing with my phone?
- 32 TONY: Are you Spike?
- 33 DEVIN: Spike? What are you talking about.
- 34 TONY: Oh, nothing, it's just that Norris thought you might
- 35 be Spike.

- 1 DEVIN: Norris? What are you doing, going through my 2 address book?
- 3 TONY: No, you see, I (DEVIN snatches phone away and looks at it, scrolling.)
- 5 DEVIN: (Growingly upset) You called Norris? And my house?
- And my mother? And ... Becky? You called Becky?
- 7 TONY: (Quietly, guiltily) It was the first name on the list.
- 8 DEVIN: What did she say?
- 9 TONY: You don't want to know.
- 10 DEVIN: Shoot, I've been trying to get the nerve up to call her
- for two weeks. What in the world did you say to her?
- 12 TONY: I didn't get to say anything. Trust me, though, be
- 13 glad you didn't call her.
- 14 DEVIN: I should call the cops for you stealing my phone and
- 15 invading my privacy or something.
- 16 TONY: (Defensively) I didn't steal your phone! I found it!
- 17 DEVIN: Yeah, sure. Next time go buy your own stupid phone
- and keep your nose out of other people's business. You
- probably ruined my chances with Becky. (Storms off.)
- 20 TONY: I actually think he and Becky would make a great
- 21 couple.
