- shouldn't have called Quinn Lassie. I guess I'll go apologize.
- GINGER: That's a good idea. I think the best thing you can
   do is stop listening to other people joking and making
   fun of people and remind them how it might feel to be on
- the receiving end of that kind of "joke."CRYSTAL: Good point. Come with me?
- 8 GINGER: Sure. (They exit.)

## 7. Out of the Line of Vision

Topic: A play concerning judgments based on appearance.

## Cast:

CHRIS: tries to be open-minded and fair
TAYLOR: judgmental and easily frightened by the unknown
DIRTY MAN: poorly dressed, dirty, and looks homeless
FANCY MAN: the opposite of Dirty Man — well-dressed, etc.

- (Scene works with CHRIS and TAYLOR walking across the
- 3 CHRIS: (Excited) I can't wait to see this play. It's supposed to be really good.
- TAYLOR: (Nervously looking around) Yeah, but I hate being downtown. It's so gross.
- 7 CHRIS: Well, at least the light rail let us off like one block from the theatre. Let's just walk fast.
- 9 **DIRTY MAN**: (Approaches BOYS cautiously, hat in hand.)
  10 'Scuse me, kids. Can you spare a quarter?
- 11 TAYLOR: (Frightened and disgusted, grabs CHRIS's arm.) Ew, 12 Chris, don't look at him.
- 13 CHRIS: (To TAYLOR, confused) Huh?
- 14 TAYLOR: That guy. He's dirty. He's probably homeless. Just
- ignore him. They can be really nasty. Let's walk faster.
- 16 DIRTY MAN: (Kindly, not disturbed by the rejection) You two
- 17 kids have a blessed day now. (He walks Off-Stage.)
- 18 CHRIS: Did you hear that? He said "blessed." Now I feel bad
- 19 that we ignored him.
- 20 TAYLOR: Just because he said "blessed" doesn't mean he's
- 21 religious or anything. He probably thinks that makes
- 22 people feel more sorry for him.

- 1 FANCY MAN: (Enters from opposite entrance from where DIRTY
- 2 MAN exited. Appears sincere and a little too friendly.) Hello,
- 3 children. Can you give me directions to the Rigley
- 4 Theatre?
- 5 TAYLOR: Oh, sure. I think if you go up to that traffic light and turn right, it's right on that block.
- 7 FANCY MAN: Gee, I don't think I can find it on my own.
- 8 Would you mind walking with me?
- 9 TAYLOR: (Kindly, without hesitation) Sure. It's not too far out
- of our way.
- 11 CHRIS: (Pulls on TAYLOR's sleeve, speaks in a stage whisper)
- 12 Taylor! You shouldn't go with a stranger. We don't know
- 13 him!
- 14 TAYLOR: Oh, ease up, Chris. Look how nicely he's dressed.
- 15 He's OK. We really should be polite to people.
- 16 CHRIS: Like you were to that homeless guy?
- 17 TAYLOR: That's different. We're not supposed to be nice to
- 18 gross people, only clean people.
- 19 CHRIS: Where did you get that idea? Be kind to well-dressed
- 20 people and ridicule and ignore those dirty people.
- 21 TAYLOR: Don't be sarcastic. This guy is perfectly fine and
- 22 you're just being bullheaded.
- 23 FANCY MAN: You know, (Mimes getting into a car) I hurt my
- foot last week and I really can't walk very far. Would you
- 25 mind very much getting in my car and helping me find
- 26 that bank?
- 27 CHRIS: (Now highly suspicious) I thought you said you
- 28 wanted Rigley Theatre?
- 29 FANCY MAN: Oh, uh, right. That's where I'm going. I'm so
- 30 absentminded.
- 31 TAYLOR: (Also finally understanding the possible danger) Uh, I
- 32 don't think we should get into your car.
- 33 FANCY MAN: (Trying to be persuasive, beginning to sound odd)
- Oh, come on. It's only a block or two, like you said.
- 35 You'd really be helping me. I'm supposed to meet my

- grandmother and I don't want to be late.
- 2 TAYLOR: (Wanting to believe) Oh, if your grandmother is
- 3 there, I'm sure it's OK.
- 4 CHRIS: Taylor! (To FANCY MAN) Uh, sorry Mister, but we've
- 5 got to get going. We can't go with you.
- FANCY MAN: (Not nice at all now. Firm and angry) Come on,
- now, don't be difficult. You said you would help.
- 8 CHRIS: We've really got to get going.
- 9 FANCY MAN: (Very angry and ominous) Get into the car.
- 10 Now.
- 11 DIRTY MAN: (Running on from Off-Stage) Hey, kids, I was
- wondering where you were. You really shouldn't have run
- off like that. I've been looking for you.
- 14 TAYLOR: (Confused but beginning to understand) Oh ... uh ...
- sorry, uh ... Uncle Bob. We were just trying to give this
- 16 man some directions.
- 17 DIRTY MAN: (To FANCY MAN) Sorry, fella, but I've got to get
- these kids back home before their mom sends a search
- 19 committee out for me. You ready, kids?
- 20 CHRIS: Oh, sure. (To TAYLOR, forcefully) Let's go. (FANCY
  - MAN drives off angry. ALL watch him go.)
- 22 TAYLOR: (To DIRTY MAN) Thank you, Mister. He was weird.
- 23 I think he was —
- 24 DIRTY MAN: No problem. I thought he looked like he was
- looking for trouble. I'm glad you're OK. You know, you
- should never get into a car with a stranger. I'm sure your
- 27 mother told you that.
- 28 CHRIS: Uh, yes, of course. It's just that he looked so ...
- 29 TAYLOR: Nice.
- 30 DIRTY MAN: Well, looks can be deceiving, can't they? (Gives
- them a minute to consider.)
- 12 TAYLOR: (Looking at DIRTY MAN, pauses, and recognizes his
- mistake.) Yes, you're absolutely right. Thanks so much
- for coming to our rescue. (Gives him some change.)
- 15 DIRTY MAN: Don't mention it. God bless you two. You'd

- better get going. Be careful now.
- 2 CHRIS: We will. Thank you. Really, thanks so much. And I'm
- 3 sorry for —
- 4 DIRTY MAN: Don't mention it. Really, don't mention it. Bye.
- 5 (He leaves.)
- 6 TAYLOR: Well, we completely misjudged those two men,
- 7 didn't we?
- 8 CHRIS: Yeah, and all because of what they looked like. Who
- 9 would have thought?
- 10 TAYLOR: I guess that shows that you really can't judge
- people by how they look. Are we going to make our show
- 12 on time?
- 13 CHRIS: Oh, yeah, but we'd better hurry. I can't wait to see
- 14 Julie Quinn.
- 15 TAYLOR: Oh? Have you seen her act before?
- 16 CHRIS: No, but she's gorgeous. If she was a dinosaur, she'd
- 17 be a babe-a-saurus.
- 18 TAYLOR: So much for your lesson on judging books by their
- 19 cover.
- 20 CHRIS: Oh, was this play a book first?
- 21 TAYLOR: Let's go. I think you need to get out of the sun.

## 8. The Project

**Topic:** Group of students trying to get motivated to put together a project

## Cast:

COURTNEY: a go-getter, trying to work correctly and up against lazy classmates

BEN: would rather be anywhere but here; he's lazy, sarcastic, and bored

ILAN: the class brainiac and extremely well-spoken

KIM: nice, fun-loving, and loves to eat

- (ALL sitting around in various positions. COURTNEY has
- 2 paper and pencil, trying to take notes. BEN is trying to sleep.
- ILAN is sitting upright, hyper-focused. KIM is playing with her hair, her mind obviously elsewhere.)
- COURTNEY: (Obviously been working at this for a while) If we don't start on this, we're never gonna finish.
- BEN: (Tossing a ball in the air and catching it) I hate these stupid projects. Why do we have to do this stuff
- anyway?
- 10 ILAN: (Softly, but assuredly and clearly) To enhance our
- learning and increase our appreciation for the world
- 12 around us.
- 13 KIM: You sound like a walking encyclopedia, Ilan.
- 14 ILAN: Well, I think it's an interesting and engaging
- opportunity.
- 16 BEN: Of course you do. You're like a miniature teacher.
- 17 COURTNEY: (Clapping hands) People! People! No bickering!
- We're gonna have to start if we ever want to finish.
- 19 KIM: (Shifts weight, looks at her nails.) Isn't it time to take a break? I think I need a snack.
- COURTNEY: We just started! No breaks. Let's at least get started.
