- 1 PAUL: So, your natural color, blonde hair, or half an Aalf?

  APRIL: So, what do you think, Paul?
- 3 RANDI: Because believe me, your opinion covers here! More
- 4 than you realize!
- 5 PAUX Let me think ...
- 6 APRIL: ke your time. There's no hurry ere.
- 7 PAUL: Can hoose something else? Or loes it have to be those
- 8 choices?
- 9 BRANDI: Go ahe. Choose somet ing else.
- 10 PAUL: I'm thinking Rright registreaks.
- 11 NICOLE: I love that ide
- 12 APRIL: You do?
- 13 BRANDI: I like it, too.
- 14 PAUL: I think that woy clook go con you, Nicole.
- 15 NICOLE: Thanks, Pa
- 16 PAUL: No problem Nell, see ya. (He ex.
- 17 NICOLE: (In a damy tone) See ya ...
- 18 BRANDI: So c. with the blonde and in with e red.
- 19 NICOLE: (S. I looking dreamy in the direction P. V. left) Maybe
- I shald dye my eyebrows red, too ... and wear ad lipstick
- 21 a maybe some red pants and a red shirt ... ah ... and
- 22 Aaybe he will really notice me ...
- 23 A AL: (Hollers as she exits.) Hey, Paul! Can we have anoth
- opinion over here?

## 24. The Laughing Technique

CAST: (1M, 1F) TARA, RANDY SETTING: Classroom.

PROPS: Straws, scissors.

- (At rise TARA sits at a desk cutting straws. RANDY walks by,
- 2 stops, and watches her.)
- 3 RANDY: Why are you cutting straws?
- 4 TARA: They're for my anti-smoking project.
- 5 RANDY: You're using straws?
- 6 TARA: Well, I can't actually use cigarettes, can I?
- 7 RANDY: What about those candy cigarettes?
- 8 TARA: Randy, they don't make candy cigarettes anymore! Now
- 9 they're called candy sticks.
- 10 RANDY: Oh. Bummer.
- 11 TARA: Bummer?

- 12 RANDY: I don't mean bummer they don't make candy
- 13 cigarettes anymore, which might encourage kids to
- smoke, but bummer you have to use straws, which don't
- 15 actually look like cigarettes.
- 16 TARA: Well, it's the best I can do.
- 17 RANDY: (Picks up a straw.) So, what are you going to do? Walk
- around pretending to smoke, and then go into a violent
- coughing episode? (Coughs.)
- 20 TARA: No! But I am looking for volunteers to perform a skit
  - that I wrote. And Mr. Wilson, my health teacher, said he's
- going to pick the three best skits to be performed at the
- elementary schools.
- 24 RANDY: Sorry, Tara, but I can't act.

- TARA: Too bad, because you get to miss school for an entire day, go eat pizza for lunch, and ... 2
- RANDY: Miss school? Hey, you know what? I think I can act 3 after all! (Dramatically) "Romeo, Romeo, wherefore art 4
- thou Romeo?" 5
- TARA: (Shaking her head) That was bad. 6
- RANDY: Oh. How about this! "Give me Liberty or give me 7 Death! Smoke cigarettes and you die!" 8
- TARA: Uh, I'm the writer and you're the actor. You have to say what I write.
- RANDY: Sure, sure. (Picks up a straw.) But I might have a few 11 helpful add-ons. 12
- TARA: I don't need help with the skit, Randy. I just need actors.
- RANDY: And an actor you have! (Smoking the straw) Sure, kids,
- you may think smoking looks cool as you strut around 15 with a straw ... I mean, cigarette ... But let me tell you what
- 16 this straw ... I mean, cigarette ... is really all about! (Throws 17
- straw on ground and stomps on it. Pointing at the audience)
- It will fry your lungs, that's what it will do! Smoking 19
- causes cancer, cataracts, lung diseases, heart attacks, 20
- asthma, and diminishes overall health! And studies have 21
- shown that during the years of 1995 to 1999, smoking 22
- caused 440,000 premature deaths! And that was annually 23 So listen to me, you bratty kids, don't smoke, because it's 24
- not cool! (Tosses straw on the ground.) 25
- 26 TARA: Wow.
- RANDY: (Proudly) Good, huh?
- TARA: I meant, wow, you really know your facts.
- RANDY: Hey, I'm in health too.
- TARA: Like I said, Randy, you have to follow my script. Not 30 make up your own. 31
- 32 RANDY: OK, OK. I was just giving you a little sample. And here's
- something else you might want to add in that little skit of 33
- yours! (Picks up another straw and pretends to smoke.) 34
- Cigarette smoke stinks! (Tosses straw to the ground and 35

- waves arms in the air.) Yuck, yuck, yuck! (Picks up another
- 2 straw.) So don't smoke! Unless you want to smell like a stinking ashtray!
- TARA: That's not the approach I'm taking, Randy.
- RANDY: (Picks up another straw.) And cigarette smoking
- pollutes! It's one of the most common forms of pollution
- on the planet! Jot this down, you miniature people! ETS! Yes, that's right! ETS! Environmental Tobacco Smoke,
- a.k.a. pollution! So, you want to go around polluting our
- environment? Huh? Huh? Do you? (Tosses straw to the 10 ground.) and an assessment allow another and
- 11
- 12 TARA: You're being a little harsh on the elementary kids, don't you think?
- 13
- 14 RANDY: No! Sometimes you have to do a little screaming and
- 15 threatening to get your point across!
- TARA: I was thinking I'd use the laughing technique.
- 17 RANDY: The laughing technique? What's that?
- TARA: Where you get your point across using humorous
- examples. You know, make the kids laugh.
- RANDY: Tara, cigarette smoking is no laughing matter!
- TARA: I know, but ...
- RANDY: (Picks up another straw.) Back to our little ETS study.
- TARA: You really did pay attention in health class, didn't you?
- RANDY: If I might proceed ... (Picks up a second straw.)
- TARA: Randy, this is my skit, remember?
- RANDY: (Ignoring her) If smoking is so cool, then why don't
- people walk around with one in each hand. Be double 27
- cool? (Stands there and smokes from each straw.) See? See 28
- 29 how cool I am?
- TARA: You look stupid!
- RANDY: Of course I look stupid! (Tosses the straws to the
- 32 ground.) Or better yet ... (Picks up three straws and sticks
- 33 one in his mouth and attempts to talk with it there) Three!
- One in each hand and smoking at the same time! (Looks at 34
- 35 TARA.) Don't I look cool?

- 1 TARA: No.
- 2 RANDY: (Tosses the straws to the ground.) Or if you want to look
- 3 really cool ... (Sticks two straws in his ears) You can try
- 4 smoking from your ears!
- 5 TARA: You look stupid, Randy.
- 6 RANDY: But why quit there? (Puts straws in his nose.) And then
- 7 you can stick one in your mouth and one in each hand ...
- 8 (Turns to TARA) And I look really cool, don't I?
- 9 TARA: No.
- 10 RANDY: (Strutting) And I can just strut around like this all day ...
- 11 TARA: Hope your hair doesn't catch on fire.
- 12 RANDY: Looking all bad ...
- 13 TARA: Bad is definitely the word.
- 14 RANDY: Spending all my money on ... Hey!
- 15 TARA: What?
- 16 RANDY: (Pulls the straws from his ears and nose and tosses them
- on the ground.) That's another area you can cover.
- 18 TARA: What?
- 19 RANDY: While I was so focused on the health aspect and the
- pollution, I didn't think about this!
- 21 TARA: What?
- 22 RANDY: The expense of cigarettes!
- 23 TARA: I've got that covered in my skit, Randy. In a humorous
- 24 way.
- 25 RANDY: Oh yeah? How's that?
- 26 TARA: Well, I have this homeless person begging on the streets
- 27 and ... Wheten attended by bound to the officer
- 28 RANDY: A homeless person begging on the streets? That's
- 29 humorous?
- 30 TARA: You have to listen to the rest of it, Randy! Anyway, this
- 31 homeless person is begging for money so he can buy
- 32 cigarettes and this little old lady walks by and kicks him
- And then, as he's on the ground screaming in pain, she
- yanks him up by his hair and whacks him a few times with
- 35 her newspaper. And then ...

- 1 RANDY: And this is supposed to be humorous?
- 2 TARA: You didn't hear the rest of it, Randy!
- 3 RANDY: (Staring at her) OK.
- 4 TARA: OK, so the little old lady is whacking him across the
- 5 head like this. And then this superhero appears.
- 6 RANDY: A superhero? Superman?
- 7 TARA: Not Superman, just a superhero.
- 8 RANDY: Shouldn't your superhero have a name?
- 9 TARA: I'll think of a name, OK? So anyway, the little old lady is
- whacking him across the head and the superhero
- 11 appears.
- 12 RANDY: The superhero with no name.
- 13 TARA: And the superhero pushes the old lady away ...
- 14 RANDY: The superhero pushes an old lady?
- 15 TARA: And then the superhero picks up the homeless man and
- carries him to the moon ...
- 17 RANDY: Carries him to the moon?
- 18 TARA: Because there's no smoking on the moon! Duh!
- 19 RANDY: Who said?
- 20 TARA: Randy, it's just a known fact!
- 21 RANDY: Well, I mean, if the superhero gave the homeless man
- a cigarette and he wanted to light up on the moon ...
- 23 TARA: With no oxygen?
- 24 RANDY: Well, that's a good point.
- 25 TARA: So anyway ...
- 26 RANDY: Back to the superhero whisking the homeless man to
- 27 the moon. The sale of synal may reach year the sale of the sale
- 28 TARA: So, the superhero and the homeless man are on the
- 29 moon ...
- 30 RANDY: Does the homeless man have a name? Or is he
- 31 nameless, too?
- 32 TARA: He doesn't have to have a name for my skit.
- 33 RANDY: But the superhero should have a name.
- 34 TARA: I'll give the superhero a name, OK?
- 35 RANDY: OK.

- 1 TARA: So, anyway ...
- 2 RANDY: The superhero and the homeless man are on the moon
- 3 ... I'm still waiting for the comic relief here.
- 4 TARA: So the superhero tells the man he now owns the moon!
- 5 I mean, he now owns the entire planet!
- 6 RANDY: A planet he can't breathe on?
- 7 TARA: Randy, that's not the point!
- 8 RANDY: It will be the point if the homeless man dies. (Grabs
- 9 throat.) Air! Air! I can't breathe!
- 10 TARA: The point is ...
- 11 RANDY: Yes?
- 12 TARA: The point is ...
- 13 RANDY: The point is ... ?
- 14 TARA: The point is that there's no smoking on the moon! (Pause
- 15 as RANDY stares at her.) And he's not poor anymore! (Pause)
- 16 And the superhero saved the day!
- 17 RANDY: Uh, question. Where's the comic relief? You know, the
- 18 laughing technique you were talking about?
- 19 TARA: Randy, it's when the old lady was hitting the homeless
- 20 man with her newspaper!
- 21 RANDY: Oh. (Pause) That was funny?
- 22 TARA: Yes!
- 23 RANDY: Looks like you may need a little more help than you
- realize, Tara. Can I see your anti-smoking script?
- 25 TARA: I'm still working on it. Actually, it's just in my head right
- 26 now, but I just need to write it all down.
- 27 RANDY: Well, why don't you leave the superhero part out and
- 28 try a different angle.
- 29 TARA: But I want to do comedy.
- 30 RANDY: (Picks up straws.) Well, you're off to a good start with
- 31 these. I know, why don't you not cut them in half and let
- 32 the characters walk around like this? (Smoking a long
- 33 straw) I look stupid, don't I?
- 34 TARA: Yes.
- 35 RANDY: (To the audience) So don't smoke, unless you want to

- 1 look stupid!
- 2 TARA: I want to make sure the kids understand that smoking
- 3 makes you sick.
- 4 RANDY: Yes, I look stupid and ... (Falls to the ground, smoking
- 5 the straw.) I'm sick! I'm sick! (Coughing)
- 6 TARA: And if you smoke, you'll die.
- 7 RANDY: (Smoking and coughing) I'm dying! Dying!
- 8 TARA: Please.
- 9 RANDY: Dying! Dying! Dying!
- 10 TARA: Hurry up and die, will you?
- 11 RANDY: (Smoking and coughing as he lies on the ground) Dying!
- 12 Dying!
- 13 TARA: Will you die already?
- 14 RANDY: These cigarettes ... they ... they ... killed me! (Collapses.
- 15 A long pause as TARA continues cutting straws. He lifts his
- 16 head.) That was funny, wasn't it?
- 17 TARA: No.
- 18 RANDY: I thought it was. (Sits up.)
